This is an election year and positions are open for the FANNP Board of Directors (BOD)! The term of office is January 1, 2025, through December 31, 2026. All positions are a two-year commitment except for President-Elect. Responsibilities include attendance at BOD meetings, participation at the sponsored FANNP Symposium, and participation on established committees.

Available positions:

President-Elect*: Acts as President in their absence as designated, Chairs the Bylaws Committee, progresses to presidency upon completion of one-year term, and continues as Past-President following completion of two-year presidency term (four-year commitment).

Secretary*: Records minutes of all meetings, gives notice of all meetings, keeps bylaws and membership records, sends email blasts and Chairs the Communication Committee.

"Advancing as an NNP: Lifelong Learning, Clinical Mastery, and Compassionate Care"

- **1. Embrace Lifelong Learning:** The field of neonatology is constantly evolving with new research, technologies, and best practices. Stay curious and committed to lifelong learning by actively seeking out opportunities for continuing education, attending conferences, and staying updated on the latest evidence-based guidelines and advancements in neonatal care.

FL Legislative News: Most bills died in committee. Note: many items were added to the Health Care Bill SPB 7016.

SPB 7016: Health Care.

Revising the purpose of the Dental Student Loan Repayment Program; requiring the Department of Health to implement the Dr. and Mrs. Alfonse and Kathleen Cinotti Health Care Screening and Services Grant Program for a specified purpose; providing requirements for birth centers designated as advanced birth centers with respect to operating procedures, staffing, and equipment; requiring advanced birth centers to enter into a written agreement with a blood bank for emergency blood bank services; authorizing certain psychiatric nurses to order emergency treatment of certain patients; creating the Training, Education, and Clinicals in Health (TEACH) Funding Program for a specified purpose; enacting the Interstate Medical Licensure Compact in this state, etc. 3/21/2024 Approved by Governor.

HB 63 and 410: Protection from Surgical Smoke.

Requiring hospitals & ambulatory surgical centers to adopt & implement policies requiring use of smoke evacuation systems during certain surgical procedures. Defining the terms "smoke evacuation system" and "surgical smoke"; requiring hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers to, by a specified date, adopt and implement policies requiring the use of smoke evacuation

systems during certain surgical procedures, etc. 3/11/2024 Died in Fiscal Policy.

SB 168: Congenital CMV Screenings. Requiring certain hospitals to administer CMV screenings on newborns admitted to the hospital under specified circumstances; providing coverage under the Medicaid program for the screenings and any medically necessary follow-up reevaluations; requiring that newborns diagnosed with CMV be referred to a primary care physician for medical management, treatment, and follow-up services, etc. 5/10/2024 Approved by Governor.

HB 159: HIV Infection Prevention Drugs Authorizes licensed pharmacists to screen for HIV exposure & order & dispense HIV infection prevention drugs in accordance with written supervisory protocol; requires Board of Pharmacy to adopt rules. Approved by Governor.

HB 201: Emergency Refills of Insulin and Insulin-related Supplies or Equipment.

Authorizes emergency refill of insulin & insulin-related supplies or equipment a specified number of times per year. Approved by Governor.

HB 241: Coverage for Skin Cancer Screenings. Requires DMS to require contracted state group health insurance plans to provide coverage & payment for annual skin cancer screenings performed by specified persons without imposing any cost-sharing requirement; specifies requirement for & restriction on payments for such screenings.

4/5/2024 Approved by Governor. 4/8/2024

HB 257: Autonomous Practice by a CRNA.

Revises staff membership & clinical privileges for CRNAs; authorizes them to perform specified acts; revises practice requirements for an autonomous APNs & for Certified Nurse Midwives; authorizes autonomous APNs to perform certain acts; provides for expiration of Council on Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Autonomous Practice; authorizes certain APNs to participate in Medical Education Reimbursement & Loan Repayment Program. 3/11/2024 Died in Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee.

SB 810: Autonomous

Practice by APNs. Exempting certain certified APNs from specified medical direction requirements for clinical privileges in hospitals; revising the functions that certain CRNAs may perform without an established protocol; revising the scope of autonomous practice for certain APNs; providing for the future expiration of the Council on Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Autonomous Practice, etc. 3/11/2024 *Died* in Health Policy.

HB 771: Autonomous Practice for Certified Psychiatric Nurses Authorizes APNs who is certified as psychiatric nurse practitioner to engage in autonomous practice under certain circumstances. 3/11/2024 Died in Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee.

HB 935: Home Health Care

Services. Authorizes APNs & PAs to order or write prescriptions for certain Medicaid services. 5/10/2024 Approved by Governor.

HB 1295: Health Care **Practitioner Titles and Abbreviations.** Specifies which titles & abbreviations health care practitioners may use in their advertisements, communications, & personal identification; prohibits health care practitioners from using deceptive or misleading terms or false representations in their advertisements; requires certain health care practitioners to prominently display copy of their license in conspicuous area of their practices; provides for denial of licensure & disciplinary action. 3/5/2024 Laid on Table.

SB 1512: Controlled Substances Adding tianeptine to the list of Schedule I controlled substances, etc. 3/22/2024 *Approved by* Governor

SPB 7018: Health Care **Innovation.** Creating the Health Care Innovation Council within the Department of Health for a specified purpose; requiring the council to submit annual reports to the Governor and the Legislature; requiring the department to administer a revolving loan program for applicants seeking to implement certain health care innovations in this state; authorizing the department to contract with a third party to administer the program, including loan servicing, and manage the revolving loan fund, etc. 3/21/2024

Approved by Governor.

American Association of Nurse Practitioners (AANP) Update:

- Elections are upcoming, nominations closed.
- Health Policy conference to be held in January 2025
- Three new Specialty
 Interest Groups (SIG)
 for members: Functional
 Medicine is one of interest.
 Other current SIGs include
 Entrepreneur, Health Equity and Diversity, Health
 Informatics and Telehealth,
 Interagency Government,
 and International.
- Florida Awards: NP -Wendy Paracka and Advocate-Allison Carvajal received the AANP Advocate State Award for Excellence. This award highlights efforts to advance the NP role. The AANP NP State Award for Excellence honors NPs for the lifesaving care they provide to patients and recognizes outstanding clinical quality.

- APRN Compact-AANP feels the latest version of the APRN Compact falls short, and while not opposed, is not endorsing the current version. AANP is calling for an improved version.
- Annual AANP Conference is June 25-30, 2024 in Nashville, TN.

CNMs- As above, SPB 7016 Health Care bill removed the requirement of a transfer agreement for autonomous midwives which is positive, but added the definition and operating policies of an Advanced Birth Center which is concerning.

FANNP encourages members to actively participate at the local and state levels to advocate for the profession and effect meaningful change.

Association for all meetings, and Chairs the Finance Committee.

Member-At-Large* (4 positions): Serves on committees as assigned.

*Please see website for a complete description of position.

To be eligible to run for a position as a Member-At-Large (MAL), the NNP must be a voting or retired member in good standing with the association for a minimum of one year and without lapse in membership for more than 6 months immediately preceding the election. To be eligible to run for an officer position, the NNP must be a member in good standing of the association for a minimum of 2 years immediately preceding the election. Officer candidates will have served on the BOD or have served as an active

member on the FANNP's committees for a minimum of 2 years. Student members and associate members are ineligible to run for office.

Nominations are due by July 15, 2024. Send them to nominations@fannp.org. Ballots will be emailed to active members for voting by October 1, 2024. The voting window will be announced in the Fall edition of the FANNP newsletter. The voting window will close on Tuesday of the conference. The newly elected candidates will be announced at the FANNP Symposium Annual Member Brunch.

Calling for Research Proposals... FANNP Grants Available

Each year FANNP sets aside funds for the support of research projects. Applications for funding are reviewed by the Research Committee. It's Time to Apply for a FANNP Scholarship

One plank of the FANNP mission is to support educational opportunities for neonatal nurse practitioners.

FANNP wants to help students pursuing a degree in neonatal health care and provides scholarships of \$1000 - \$2000. Scholarship monies can be used for tuition, books or any expenses incurred while in school.

Take advantage of these funds and don't leave education money on the table. Applications for the 2024 FANNP Scholarships will be accepted until September 15, 2024. Scholarships will be awarded at the Annual FANNP Business Meeting on October 17, 2024.

Educators, preceptors, and mentors encourage students to become FANNP members and apply for scholarships.

Eligibility Guidelines

- Applicants must be FANNP members.
 - a. All voting members, student members and associate members are eligible.
 - b. Priority for scholarship awards will be given to voting members, followed by student members and then associate members.
 - c. Priority for scholarship awards will be based on length of membership and service to FANNP.
- 2. Applicants must be a licensed RN, APRN, NNP or equivalent.
 - a. Preference will be given to currently licensed NNPs working towards an advanced NNP degree.
- 3. Applicants must attend an educational program leading to a degree related to the health care field during the application period.
 - a. To be eligible for a 2024 Scholarship you must have attended classes sometime between Sept. 15, 2023 and Sept. 15, 2024).
 - b. An applicant may receive a maximum of two scholarship awards for each degree sought.
- 4. Applicants will provide a short article, case study, practice pointer, evidenced-based practice update or literature review to be published in the FANNP Newsletter.

Patent Ductus Arteriosus

- A fetal vessel that allows oxygenated blood from the placenta to bypass fetal lungs and directs the blood for systemic perfusion in utero.
- It connects the descending aorta with the main pulmonary artery. As the newborn takes their first breath, pulmonary vascular resistance decreases, which increases pulmonary blood flow. This increases the partial pressure of oxygen in arterial blood which in turns causes constriction of the ductus arteriosus. (Gillam-Krakauer & Mahajan, 2023).
- The ductus arteriosus functionally closes in about 12-24 hours in term infants and completely closes around 2-3 weeks. The closure of the ductus arteriosus is delayed in the preterm infant and can be a source of morbidities in this population.

Pathophysiology

Due to the flow of blood from the aorta to the pulmonary artery, a PDA is associated with conditions including:

- Pulmonary Edema
- Pulmonary Hemorrhage
- Necrotizing Enterocolitis
- Bronchopulmonary dysplasia
- Hypotension
- Renal failure
- Congestive heart failure (Gillam-Krakauer & Mahajan, 2023)

Physical Exam Findings

- "Machinery" Murmur most commonly continuous but can be systolic or holosystolic
- Tachycardia
- Bounding peripheral pulses
- Widened pulse pressure
- Hypoxia
- Respiratory distress

Imaging Findings

- Chest Xray: increased pulmonary vascular congestion
- Echocardiogram: PDA; if severe enough could cause left atrial and left ventricular enlargement

Treatment and Management

- Restricting the Total Fluid Limit to 110-130 mL/kg/day while providing adequate nutrition
- Increasing PEEP to decrease pulmonary edema
- Medical treatment:
 - o Acetaminophen: 15mg/kg/dose q6hrs for 3-8 days. Monitor Liver function.
 - o Ibuprofen: 5-10mg/kg q24hrs for 3 doses. Monitor urine output and renal function
 - o Indomethacin: 0.1-0.2mg/kg q12hrs for 3 doses. Monitor renal function
- Surgical ligation or transcatheter coil placement (if medical management fails)


